Studies have demonstrated that HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) can reduce HIV transmission in diverse populations with high rates of new HIV infections. However, uptake of PrEP in many settings has been slow, which could limit the impact of PrEP on the HIV epidemic. In this interactive presentation, we will review the epidemiology of HIV transmission in the US, indications for prescribing and monitoring the use of PrEP, and identifying persons who may benefit from PrEP. We will also apply the principles of PrEP provision as outlined in the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Guidelines to case examples from primary care. At the completion of this program, the participant should be able to:

- Describe the epidemiology of HIV transmission in the US;
- List indicators for prescribing HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP);
- Outline processes for identifying persons who may benefit from PrEP, prescribing PrEP, and monitoring persons who are using PrEP;
- Apply the CDC guidelines regarding PrEP to case examples.
